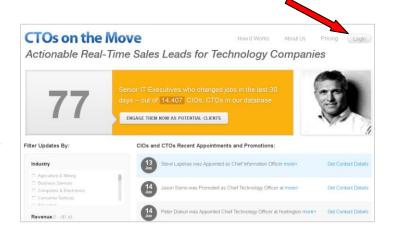
This will be an awesome ride and I'd like to give a few direction tips to make the journey easier and more productive.

1. Logging in

The home page has plenty of useful features, like customizable search of IT execs who changed jobs in the last 30 days. I'd encourage you to explore it.

Further, to login simply click on the login button and...





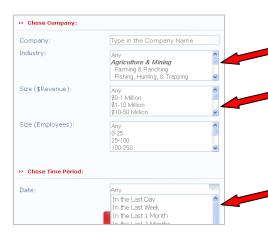
You will get to the login screen here. Just enter your email and the password you created during sign up and click "Sign In".

If you forgot your password you can quickly retrieve it as well.

2. Searching

Once you are logged in, you are now at the "Advanced Search" screen.

Here you can search by "Title", "Type of Management Change", "Geography" and other parameters, like...





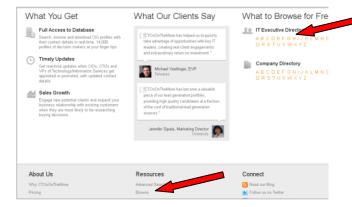
..."Company Name", "Industry", "Company Size" and "Date of Change".

Feel free to play around with controls, tighter parameters will give you fewer, however more focused results.

3. Browsing

To browse the listings in the database simply scroll down and there you have an option to browse by IT executive name/Company name – both listed alphabetically OR...

Go through a database crosssection through this link in the footer





Now here you can browse by all the categories you can also search by, specifically:

- Industry
- Geography
- Title
- Size (Revenue)
 - Size (Employees)

Once you click on one of the lines, you will get to the results page here:





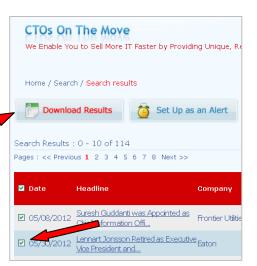
... if you hover your cursor over their headline, you will see a small pop-up appear that gives you a snippet of the press release.

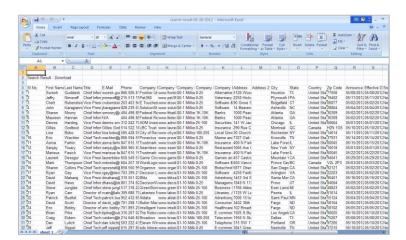
You can click through to the full text of the press release where you can get insights like where the CIO worked before, who he/she reports to, what mandate they were hired on, etc.

4. Downloading

Once you are satisfied with the search results and you are ready to get the details out, simply chose the records you want be checking the "select" box here...

... and the click "Download Results"





Presto! There you go!

These are the results of your search, with all the fields: emails, addresses, the full text of the press release (where available) and more...

Feel free to upload these results to Salesforce.com or any other CRM system you may be using. The data is enriched with actionable insights and can be put to use right away, including but not limited to:

- Outbound email
- Outbound phone campaigns
- Events, webinars, face-to-face meeting invitations
